Be kind to each other, tender-hearted, forgiving one another just as Christ forgave us. Ephesians 4:32 NLT

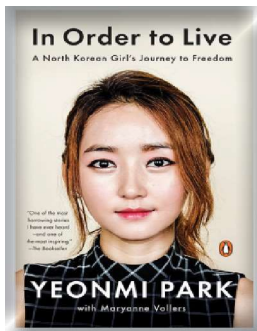
The Bible is filled with scripture about getting along with others and overlooking offenses.

January 10, 2024 SNRW General Meeting Minutes at COD Casino, Minden, Nevada

The meeting held at COD Casino was called to order by President Pat Smith at 12:PM. Pat welcomed guests and dignitaries; Senator Robin Titus, Douglas County Commissioners Mark Gardner and Sharla Hales, MGSD Trustee Sondra Condrón.

Sondra Condrón led the Pledge of Allegiance and Laurie Trotter gave the invocation.

1st VP Leslie Lawson introduced the guest speaker, Nevada Senator Robin Titus.

Robin Titus explained the issue of two elections, the Primary on Feb 6 and the Caucus on Feb 8. It is important to vote in both Primary and Caucus elections and if your candidate is not listed, choose 'none of the above'. The most important focus is to get Republicans elected for the Nevada Senate and Assembly. Senator Titus says your VOTE sends a message that Republicans will show up! She advised voting early to ensure against bad weather and it would be best to deliver your ballot to the County Clerks office.

The minutes of the previous General Meeting, were approved as printed in the January Rumbler Newsletter.

Leslie Lawson announced the February guest speaker is Sam Brown, candidate for US Senator. There is no meeting in March due to the annual St Pat's Dinner and Silent Auction fundraiser on March 9th. April 10 meeting will feature the Entrepreneur of the Year 2023 Awards with previous winners and current candidates invited as we announce the winner for 2023.

Treasurer Mary Lou Gervie reported that the checkbook is balanced.
