This caused problems when the Traditional Values Club hosted a Stand Up for Religious Freedom rally on the college campus, which ended with the police being called upon and the participants being forced to hide their signs.

But there is hope!

Students want something other than the agenda that is forced upon them. The students harmed by Ohio's Sinclair Community College's ban had decided to reach out and file a lawsuit against the college. With the help of the Foundation for Individual Rights and Expression, they won! Eventually, the college was forced to change its policies and remove the ban on signage.

There are many more stories like this one of students fighting for their rights. **Young people want to make a change in their world for the better, and they are willing to take action.**

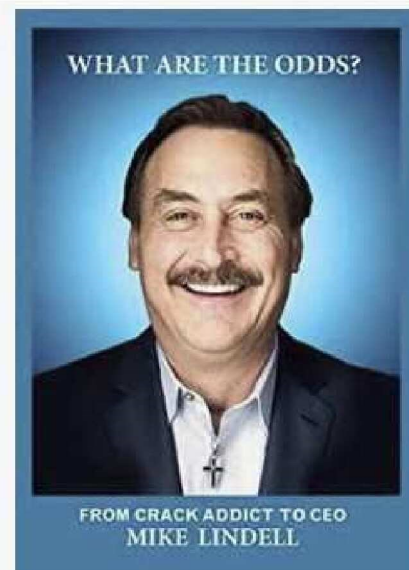

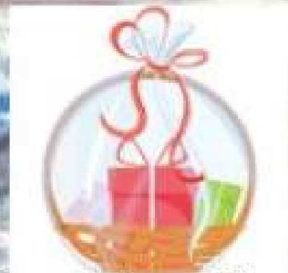

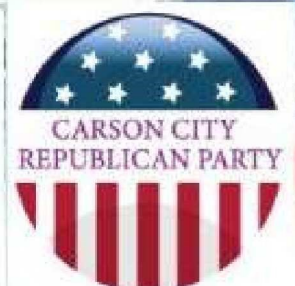

An interesting bit of history and American Ingenuity



POW & MIA BRACELETS

Nickel-plated and copper bracelets, created about May of 1970, had the rank, name, and 'loss' date engraved on the bracelet.

During the Viet Nam war, 726 soldiers were taken prisoner and or killed. Of those, 661 were returned. Two college students came up with the idea to make bracelets to increase awareness of the ongoing war without controversy so our POWs would not be forgotten.

Nickel bracelets cost 30 cents to make, and copper was 75 cents. They sold for \$2.50 and \$3.00. **Over four million were sold, with \$7 million raised.** Movie stars, fashion models, and grandparents wore them. They were worn all the time, only taken off to shower. They often turned the skin green, prompting many people to line the inside of the bracelet with clear nail polish.

When the POW came home, the bracelets were often given to the soldier. There are three on display at the National Museum of American History in Washington, D.C.
