Volunteer Campaign Hours

Volunteer, Keep Track, and Report Your Hours for the NFRW Campaign Award Program

The National Federation of Republican Women established the Campaign Award Program to honor clubs for the time spent volunteering for our Republican Party and Republican candidates. Over the years, Mary Lou Gervie, who again is chairing this program for SNRW, has recorded thousands of Volunteer



Campaign Hours that SNRW members and associates have contributed to the cause and reported to her.

Recently, Mary Lou messaged each member and associate a list of activities that NFRW qualifies for the program and a form for keeping track of them so that you can report your volunteer hours to her conveniently. As stated in her message, "It is not only important for the SNRW club Achievement Awards that we involve ourselves in campaign activities, but also to show strong support for Republican candidates."

Several SNRW members and associates already have accumulated Volunteer Campaign Hours. You have volunteered at Republican Headquarters and attended the March Precinct Meetings and Republican County Convention. Some of you have held candi-

date meet and greets.
Some of you even are candidates for office.
Mary Lou would like to collect your July 1, 2021, through May 31, 2022.
Please begin collecting your hours monthly starting immediately but going back as far as July 21, 2021.

Many of our members and associates who have

participated in this program are familiar with the procedure.

For volunteers, all non-paid campaign activities benefitting our Republican Party, candidates, and the Federation, which are done at home or outside the home, are included—mailings, phone calls, computer work, social media postings, or blogging. Work at and for special campaign events also counts unless you are a paid guest or have been compensated. Please note that SNRW can count the volunteer time of our male associate members if SNRW is the primary club of a spouse or friend who is an SNRW member.

It's time to do this again. Campaign volunteering is what we are about.

For our newer members and associates
who may be involving themselves
in Nevada campaigns for the first time,
it is important to make a habit of turning in your
Volunteer Campaign Hours to Mary Lou Gervie each month.

Feel free to contact her if you have any questions about the program.

Tis essential for the SNRW club's Achieve ment Awards that we involve ourselves in campaign activities and show strong support for our Republican candidates. I have attached a list of ways that you accumulate hours for this important program, including volunteering at Republican Headquarters,



attending the Douglas County Republican Convention, and holding a candidate "meet and greet."

Remember that "candidates" include Republican candidates running for nonpartisan offices, such as the school board.

NFRW Policy for Counting Volunteer Hours

The following policy details activities that can be included in your volunteer campaign hours:

- 1. All non-paid campaign activities benefiting our Republican Party, candidates, and/or the Federation.
- 2. Campaign work done within or outside the home, including mailings, phone calls, computer work, and social media postings or blogging.
- 3. Work at and/or for a special campaign event but NOT if you attend as a paid guest OR if you are compensated for the event.
- 4. Attendance at (and travel portal to portal) State or National Federation Board of Directors Meetings and Conventions as well as time spent in preparation for Federation meetings if you serve on a committee.
- 5. Time in session at (and travel portal to portal) municipality, precinct/ward, county, district, or state party conventions.
- 6. Time in session at (and travel portal to portal) RNC conventions.
- 7. Time spent as a county, state, or national party committee member or as a temporary member, i.e. Rules Committee, Resolutions Committee, etc.
- 8. Campaign work at club meetings, i.e. getting petitions signed, doing mailings. DO NOT COUNT TIME SPENT IN REGULAR BUSINESS AT CLUB MEETINGS.
- 9. Traveling from event to event but NOT for personal stops en route.
- 10. Volunteering at any municipality, county, state or Federation headquarters.

- 11. Volunteering for a Republican candidate for a non-partisan office, e.g. school board elections.
- 12. Working as a poll watcher on Election Day but NOT if you are paid.
- 13. Involvement in a Campaign Management School, i.e. training to be a faculty member, teaching and organizing a campaign school.
- 14. Working on Election Day as an Election Judge or Election Clerk but only if you turn the money you are paid over to your county party or your local FRW club.
- 15. Presenting campaign programs or speeches at local civic organizations, but NOT if paid.
- 16. Appearing on local media for the GOP cause.
- 17. Running for office all time spent campaigning.
- 18. Time spent registering voters.
- 19. Hours spent as editor of a club newsletter or state newsletter and hours spent as club yearbook chairman.
- 20. The time of Associate members (women) volunteering for the Federation or individual clubs, or GOP, i.e. working at the HQ of the Party or a candidate, putting up signs, etc. can only be counted by ONE individual club, the primary club of the member. The time of Associate members (men) volunteering can be counted in the primary club of his spouse or friend who is the member of that club.

Call to order: The April meeting of SNRW was called to order at 11:49 a.m., Wednesday, April 13, 2022, by the President, Sondra Condron, at the C.O.D. Casino in Minden, NV. She welcomed everyone and reminded members to silence their phones. The prayer was given by member Carmen Bowman, followed by the salute to our great flag by Blayne Osborn.

Save the Elephant: President Condron stated that April 16 is the national Save the Elephant day, noting that more than 80 elephants are killed each day by poachers. With the intention to help save the (Republican) elephant, several canisters were placed at the tables, and she asked attendees to donate to the cause. She reminded members that SNRW is a P.A.C., and thus, it donates to Republican candidates during election years.

Treasurer: St. Patrick's Dinner results: Treasurer Jacie Peters reported that 171 attended the St. Patrick's dinner at Carson Valley Inn. It was a very successful event. She noted funds are raised to support Republican candidates and that in the election year, we take the checkbook balance down to the bare minimum. Monies from the St. Patrick's dinner are used for the candidates and to help keep enough funds to maintain the club. Next year the committee (Jacie Peters, Pat Smith, and Sally Grant) would like to see an increase in donated auction items and increased ticket sales.

Treasurer Peters gave the financial report (copy attached to original Minutes) and noted the

club will be able to make significant donations to Republican candidates in the general election.

Minutes: President Condron noted there was no meeting in March because of the St. Patrick's dinner and called for approval of the February 9, 2022 Minutes. M.S.C. that the Minutes of the February 9, 2022 meeting be approved as distributed through The Rumbler.

Announcements: Items for the next edition of The Rumbler are due to Anita Kornoff by April 25.



A BOOK REVIEW

THE PRIVATE WORLD of the PRESIDENTIAL RETREAT



I found this book to be extremely fascinating. I've always heard of Camp David, but never really understood what it was. This book gives an in-depth, personal and detailed review of the what, where and why of Camp David. It is a little out of date, ending in the Obama era, but is still worth the read.

The first-ever insider account of Camp David, the president's private retreat, on the seventy-fifth anniversary of its inception.

For seventy-five years, Camp David has served as the president's private retreat. A home away from the hustle and bustle of Washington, this historic site is the ideal place for the First Family to relax, unwind, and, perhaps most important, escape from the incessant gaze of the media and the public. It has hosted decades of family gatherings for thirteen presidents, from Franklin D. Roosevelt to Barack Obama, including holiday celebrations, reunions, and even a wedding. But more than just a weekend getaway, Camp David has also been the site of private meetings and high-level summits with foreign leaders to foster diplomacy.

Former Camp David commander Rear Admiral Michael Giorgione, CEC, USN (Ret.), takes us deep

into this enigmatic and revered sanctuary. Combining fascinating first-person anecdotes of the presidents and their families with storied history and interviews with commanders both past and present, he reveals the intimate connection felt by the First Families with this historic retreat.

Never before have the gates of Camp David been opened to the public. Intensely private and completely secluded, the president's personal campground is situated deep in the woods, up miles of unmarked roads that are practically invisible to the untrained eye. Now, for the first time, we are allowed to travel along the mountain route and directly into the fascinating and intimate complex of rustic residential cabins, wildlife trails, and athletic courses that make up the presidential family room.


