

President's Message—

NvFRW 37th Session Biennial Convention in Reno

his past weekend, from October 20-22, the Nevada Federation of Republican Women held the Biennial Convention where new officers were elected, and bylaw changes were voted on.

When I first became involved with organizations with local, state, and federal structures, I learned how member institutions govern on a large scale. For

Republican women, we have local clubs that affiliate under the state-Nevada Federation of Republican Women, which operates under the National Federation of Republican Women. These types of structures are similar to government bodies in that your local legislators abide by state law, which is dictated by federal law. Members are much like constituents in that they drive

policy, and their elected representatives are tasked with decision-making based that reflects the will of the members.

This was my first state convention for a political party. The discussion and debate on NvFRW bylaw changes was lively, with 108 voting delegates in attendance from all over the state. After much discussion, bylaw changes that were mostly "clean up" language were passed, with future possible changes pushed off to the next Biennial Convention in 2025. Some attendees lamented the conflict in the deliberations. However, my overall impression was that the membership is highly engaged, passionate, and invested in the health of the Republican organizations.

The Sierra Nevada Republican Women had three voting delegates: myself, Sondra Condon, Immediate Past President, and Pat Smith, former President and

active member. We also voted on the election of officers. There was only one seat that was contested, the Southern Nevada Director. Both candidates gave speeches, and after secure votes were cast, the following were our new

We also had three presentations in the afternoon session:
Jim DeGraffenreid, the National Republican
Committeeman, clarified the party's position on the Nevada primary

election and the upcoming caucus. Trent England, the Executive Director of Save our States, spoke about the national popular vote.

Daniel Honchariw discussed the possible implementation of ranked-choice voting. I could write a book on all of the information presented at the conference; however, I will save these topics for this month's letter for the next communications. I hope to see you all at Nevada Day this weekend, it is one of my favorite holidays! Rain, snow, or ice, I will be at the parade to celebrate our Battle Born State.


