

If you feel disappointed, frustrated, or defeated by the way things seem to be going in our country, keep reading because you're going to hear one of the greatest stories of perseverance in overcoming defeat in American history.



This story will not only bring you hope and inspiration, but also the courage to keep going in the face of difficulties. As the popular saying goes, it's always darkest before the dawn, and nothing brings us more joy than overcoming difficulties together.

The power of never giving up is well illustrated by one of the most influential American presidents in history. His accomplishments, especially at critical times, set the destiny and direction of our nation. They far surpassed the challenges faced along the way, and they were not minor or few in number.

Americans have President Abraham Lincoln to thank for never giving up. Lincoln lost eight elections before becoming the 16th president of the United States. You can find the full record of his life in several historical sources; we've gathered these from the book *Chicken Soup for the Soul* by Jack Canfield. Here are some of Lincoln's notable defeats.

- In 1832, he ran for a seat in the Illinois State Legislature and lost. Two years later, he won and was re-elected three times.
- In 1838, he aspired to become speaker of the state legislature and lost.
- In 1840, he sought to become an elector in the Electoral College and lost.
- In 1843, he ran for the House of Representatives and lost. When he ran again in 1846, he won.
- In 1854, he ran for the U.S. Senate and lost.
- In 1856, he sought the vice-presidential nomination at this party's national convention and got fewer than 100 votes.
- In 1858, he ran for the U.S. Senate again and lost again.

- Finally, he ran for president in 1860, and things turned out far differently for him and for the nation. The rest, as they say, is history.

Abraham Lincoln kept loyal to his ideals, his beliefs,

and his vision for America. What if he had stopped after his first defeat? We urge you to never stop defending your core beliefs, our American traditions, and our ways of life, no matter the circumstances—just as Lincoln did.

Volunteer in the Spotlight — Dianne Ford

Nevada became my home seven years ago, following residences in nine other states across the U.S. Within two years as a Nevanadan, it became clear that Douglas County is home to the kindest, most generous, and supportive people in our country. Individuals here do not just care; they take action. They volunteer throughout the community to assist those in need and make it a better place to live.

My father taught us, and God tells us, to serve others. What better place than Douglas County, where there are so many opportunities to lend a helping hand, or ear, goods, or funds.

I moved here to help my father, who was legally blind. After taking him to a Sertoma (Service to Mankind) Oktoberfest event, I joined Sertoma and began my Nevada volunteer service. Sertoma's primary focus is speech and hearing. Individuals who need hearing aids but cannot afford them should contact Social Services. If qualified, their names are passed on to Sertoma, who can provide hearing aids. The Lions Club offers a similar program for vision.

Other organizations include Carson Tahoe Regional Health Center who provides education, support groups, wigs, garments, cottage stays, and financial assistance to cancer

patients. Volunteers are needed in most departments throughout Carson Tahoe and most likely at Carson Valley Medical Center. Consider volunteering once COVID-19 suspensions are lifted.



Douglas County Sheriffs Office (DCSO): As a Report Writer, my role is to answer calls, schedule vacation and vehicle identification number (VIN) checks, take lost/stolen items reports, and help with any other duties. CP members can also serve on patrol to complete vacation and VIN checks, monitor abandoned vehicles, provide traffic control, and offer further assistance as needed.

In either role, Citizen's Patrol volunteers relieve DCSO deputies of administrative duties, thus keeping deputies out in the community for our protection. The DCSO also supports the Good Neighbor program developed by Sergeant Bernadette Smith. The Good Neighbor

program reaches out to seniors in our community who are alone or have special needs. Douglas County has over 7,000 residents over the age of 65. Of those residents, 21% live alone. Volunteers are trained and paired with a client to call or visit at least once a week. Most of these seniors just need someone to listen. Through ongoing contact, a volunteer can also identify and report or assist when their senior needs to obtain medical, home care, or financial assistance. While it's hard to believe, others are being exploited and need the DCSO to step in for their protection.

Our Good Neighbor clients become our friends. These are generally sweet and genuine individuals who are lonely, abused, abandoned. " They need someone to care, someone like a Good Neighbor. I currently volunteer as a Good Neighbor to three individuals and also assist with administrative work in the office once a week. Volunteers can provide calls only or supplement with visits. Be involved as little or as much as you would like or can do. To apply, fill out an application and schedule fingerprinting at the DCSO on Buckeye Road.

Community Emergency Response Team (CERT): As CERT members, we are trained to respond and assist during emergencies to identify and

triage injuries, administer first aid, manage sheltering, assist with traffic control, and the many other facets of emergent needs and care. Before COVID-19, we had monthly training sessions to learn these skills. We likewise operate a rehab trailer for emergencies and Fire Department training classes, provide CPR and AED training sessions, and assist where otherwise requested. Currently, we are assisting at the COVID-19 test and inoculation sites.

Other volunteer activities include Carson Valley Community Theater, Carson Valley Arts Council, Vitalant blood and plasma donor, St. Mary's Hospice, and more. I'm also a member of Footprinters (supporting the DCSO), Sierra Nevada Republican Women, and the Women's Auxiliary of Carson Tahoe Regional Health Center.

There are many people in need throughout Carson Valley and a plethora of opportunities to serve.

Please reach out to volunteer. Consider the organizations above or others like the Carson Valley Community Food Closet or Nevada State Railroad Museum. Find one that fits you where you would like to help. What you get back from volunteering is far more than what you give, and good friends are made in the process.



Just Wondering...


Does anybody know, when, or why the stars were turned upside down on the Republican Elephant Logo?

#DELETED: Big Tech's Battle to Erase the Trump Movement and Steal the Election

How the most powerful tech companies in the world determined to stop Donald Trump.

Journalist Allum Bokhari spent four years investigating the tech giants that dominate the Internet: Google, Facebook, YouTube, Twitter. He discovered a dark plot to seize control of the flow of information, and utilize that power to its full extent--to censor, manipulate, and ultimately sway the outcome of democratic elections. His network of whistleblowers inside Google, Facebook and other companies explain how the tech giants now see themselves as "good censors," benevolent commissars controlling the information we receive to "protect" us from "dangerous" speech. They reveal secret methods to covertly manipulate online information without us ever being aware of it, explaining how tech companies can use big data to target undecided voters. They lift the lid on a plot four years in the making--a plot to use the power of technology to stop Donald Trump's re-election.

Big Tech uses certain buzzwords to justify its censorship, cleverly all vague, used as excuses to crack down on conservative content. They include "fake news," "misinformation," "hate speech," "harassment," and even "bots." Twitter employees have admitted if an account has a certain number of words, such as "guns" and "God" in their profile, they may delete it, claiming it was a bot.

Dr. Robert Epstein, a senior research psychologist at the American Institute for Behavioral Research and Technology and a Democrat, explained to Congress how Google shifted 2.6 to 10.4 million users to Hillary Clinton in the 2016 election. Experiments have been done showing how certain candidates were favored over others



based on biased search results. On Google, that means showing negative results about conservative candidates and positive results about left-leaning candidates at the top of search results. On Facebook, if a certain video influenced a conservative to take a less conservative viewpoint, that video would show up higher in the newsfeed of other conservatives.

Bokhari says the problem is the internet is no longer being run like the free market. There has been a corporate takeover of the web, as it's become an oligopoly controlled by a handful of Big Tech companies.

Some free market conservatives resist taking any measures against Big Tech, refusing to admit the internet has degenerated into an oligopoly. They recommend creating our own competing tech companies. But precisely because the internet is now an oligopoly, it is impossible for conservative tech companies to get anywhere.

The reality is 43% of Americans get their news from Facebook. And you can't survive in conservative media without it. A Facebook insider told Bokhari in 2017 their plan was to get people to move from the right to the center. And sure enough, Facebook's newsfeed change in January 2018 destroyed far more conservative pages than left wing. They have a "hate agent" list that includes people like Candace Owens. Facebook tracks what people do offline too, using their associations with "hate" against them. Facebook is forcing the right to de-network itself, online and offline.

The book goes on to detail the many ways Big Tech censors conservatives by cutting them off from advertisers that fund them, smear campaigns and much more.
